Evesham Sensory Garden Revamp

Outside the Almonry, adjacent to the entrance to All Saints Church, is an area known as the sensory garden. It has served as an area where people could come and spend time and take in the different plants. However, it has now become overgrown and not very inviting.

We want to redo the garden, open it out so people can see that it's there and place a flagpole as a feature in the centre.

Flagpole

At present, the only public flagpole in Evesham is located at the police station on Abbey Road. This is controlled by the West Mercia Police.

Several local residents have suggested that the Town Council should invest in a flagpole on its own property where it is able to fly flags marking the events such as Commonwealth Day, Armed Forces Day, local events such as Battle of Evesham, Worcestershire Pride, etc.

The revamp of the sensory gardens offers an opportunity to install a flagpole, making it the centrepiece of the scheme and forming the focal point surrounded by planting or stones.

How much

We are seeking £21,000 from NHB, and if successful, the Council would look to put in some money from its own budget.
